Procedures for communication | Background

- The JISC, at its seventh meeting, has agreed on procedures for communication of the public with the Joint Implementation Supervisory Committee.
- This document defines how to handle communication of the public with the JISC by:
 - responding to specific communication/invitation by the JISC;
 - sending communication without preceding communication/invitation by the JISC, referred to as unsolicited communication.
- Two types of requests can be distinguished:
 - administrative, technical and/or procedural issues;
 - substantive specific issues.

Different scenarios need to be considered:

Requests that are addressed to the JISC of substantive nature (handle as unsolicited communication);

Requests that are addressed to the JISC of general nature (handle as unsolicited communication);

Requests that are addressed to the secretariat of substantive nature (?);

Requests that are addressed to the secretariat of general nature (?);

The JISC might consider to broaden the mandate to the secretariat to assess the nature of incoming requests.

The JISC might consider to broaden the scope of the document for the communication to the secretariat.
